2026 Membership Dues/Assessment Bills

At the November 4, 2025 Meeting of the Executive Board of Harwinton Rod and Gun it was voted to keep the Dues/Assessment owed by members for their 2026 Membership the same as the 2025 amounts. Active Memberships will be billed \$285.00 + 10% sales tax + Work Fine (if owed), and any delinquent amount. Family Memberships will be billed \$418.50 + 10% sales tax + Work Fine (if owed), and any delinquent amount.

The 2026 Dues/Assessment Bill will be mailed out the first week of December. Please correct any outdated contact information! If for some reason you do not receive your renewal, contact Joe Sopczneski (860) 378-5849. If you are experiencing a personal problem and would like assistance with your HRG renewal, contact Joe or any Board Member.

***(All of these types of communications are held in strict confidence and are handled on an individual basis)

Individual members may qualify for "Golden Membership" in two ways. The first qualifiers are: A member who is; at least 65 years old, retired, and a member for 15 consecutive years. The second set of qualifiers for Golden Membership is: 30 consecutive years of membership with no age or work status qualifiers. If you believe that you meet either of these for 2026, please contact the membership chairman.

If you wish to change your membership type for 2026 please indicate on your renewal form. If you chose to change to an Active Membership instead of a Family Membership, just write that on your renewal form and submit the amount you owe. If you wish to change from Active to Family Membership write that on the renewal papers and the appropriate forms will need to be sent to you. Family Membership Members turning 21 not Full Time Students or Military may join under their own Membership without regard to Waiting List nor Initiation Fee.

Please note as per By-Laws: Dues are payable January 1st with a thirty (30) day grace period. (All dues related communications must be initiated during this time period)

All members will once again be required to complete a waiver as a requirement of renewal. Membership cards will only be mailed to members who are current with their dues and have filed a correctly completed waiver for 2026 The seven yellow boxes two front five back MUST be INITIALED! CHECK MARKS or X MARKS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE!!

"Celebration of Life" Membership Award

Upon the passing of HRG Member Jeff Caron in the summer of 2022 it was decided that in Celebration of Jeff's Life a tagged fish would be stocked in our pond for Opening Day of the 2023 Fishing Season. Any Member whose ID number ends in ".0", catching this tagged fish and presenting the "Tag" to the Executive Board would be awarded a "Free Membership" in HRG for the following year. If caught by a guest of a member, the member would be the "Winner". It would be the winning member's option to use this "Free Year" of membership or give it to someone else. If given to a non-member, that person would have to meet the usual qualifications for membership of applicants to HRG. This person, if qualified, would then be admitted into membership without regard to the Waiting List or Membership Cap but would have to pay the initiation fee. If no one catches the tagged fish and turns in the "Tag" by the November 15 Pond Closing, the Free Membership will be drawn at the Annual Meeting. All current members in good standing at the time of the drawing with Membership ID's ending with ".0" will be eligible to win. They do not need to attend the meeting to win. All the "Qualifiers Above" will be applied.

Beginning in 2024, it was decided that this award would continue as a tribute to Celebrate the Lives of all past HRG Members who like Jeff Caron enjoyed Harwinton Rod and Gun to its fullest! To date the Tagged Fish has not been caught and if not by the November 15 Pond Closing will be awarded as a lucky draw as described above at The December Annual Membership Meeting for a HRG Membership the following year.

2026 - 2027 Mandatory Range Safety Orientation

Every Even Year All members of Harwinton Rod & Gun Club must attend the Mandatory Range Safety Seminar prior to using ANY of the Firearm or Archery Ranges. During the seminar pertinent club rules, range rules, general firearm and archery safety will be reviewed and stressed. All members must attend one of the scheduled seminars and sign off on the attendance sheet in 2026 or they will NOT BE ALLOWED TO USE THE RANGES!

Members who are currently allowed to use the ranges as they are reading this in November 2025 have until March 10, 2026 to take the 2026-2027 Orientation to be able to continue to use the ranges

There are Four Orientations scheduled for 2026 at the present time.

They will be presented after the closing of the January 13, February 10, and March 10 Membership Meetings and Saturday January 17th.

Remember that by Sunday January 18, 2026 YOU MUST ATTEND AND SIGN - OFF that you have attended this seminar in order to use our Ranges after January 17, 2026!

Our goal is to make everyone using HRG Ranges the "BEST POSSIBLE STEWARDS" of our Ranges and the activities practiced on them!

This past year saw the completion of the Rifle Range Pavilion Rebuilding. Over the past few years one of the benches had to be removed to make room for the Meeting Room that was constructed on the Rifle Range and then the next step was to add on to the Pavilion in order to restore the bench that had to be removed.

The finishing touch to this remodel was to install Flashing Red Lights to be activated any time people need to go down range. The lights MUST BE TURNED ON AS A WARNING that weapons are not to be handled while the lights are flashing for everyone's SAFETY! BE SURE TO DO THIS

ACTION PISTOL SHOOTS: The 2026 schedule has been put together and waiting approval from the BOD hopefully I will have this posted before January 1st


